

### **Salem Health gives \$286,000 in grants**

Salem Health has awarded \$286,500 in 2016 Community Partnership Grants, benefiting local organizations working to improve the health of local residents.

The awards went to four new recipients and four 2015 recipients for continued funding, according to a press release.

The new recipients are:

» Northwest Human Services - \$50,000 for purchasing a bus to provide healthcare for the homeless.

» Polk County Family & Community Outreach - \$50,000 for developing a suicide prevention project.

» Mano a Mano Family Center - \$50,000 to offer a family-wellness project centered on stress reduction.

» Salem Interfaith Hospitality Network - \$36,500 for trauma-informed care training and family support services.

Continued funding recipients are:

» The Salvation Army - \$25,000 to provide mental health case management for the homeless.

» Community Action Agency, HOME Youth & Resource Center - \$25,000 to offer weekend staffing at the center.

» Oregon State University, Office for Sponsored Research and Award Administration - \$25,000 to expand Just Walk Salem, a grassroots neighborhood walking program.

» Boys & Girls Club of Salem, Marion and Polk Counties - \$25,000 to staff its Healthy Lifestyles Education Program.
