Considering on Becoming a DHS Listed Providers?

The Department of Human Services (DHS) Employment Related Day Care (ERDC) program provides support to working families to help pay for child care. This support is crucial to parents, whose employment and peace of mind may depend on having stable, quality child care. Serving families receiving ERDC also benefits providers by helping to ensure full enrollment and reliable payment. Providers who serve families receiving ERDC are showing their commitment to all children in our community, including those who may be most in need. In Marion, Polk and Yamhill Counties 70 percent of child care providers are currently Listed or willing to become Listed to serve families accessing ERDC. ERDC Will Pay for Registration Fees

Currently there is NO waiting list for ERDC. In addition to helping families pay for child care, ERDC will now also help families with registration fees, which may have been a barrier for some families in the past. Providers can call the Direct Pay Unit (DPU) for more information about this new process at 1-800-699-9074 or 503-378-5500.

ERDC Pre-payment Option for Centers

- Starting April 1, DHS will allow certified centers to bill monthly for *anticipated* hours of care. Previously, billings were at the end of the month for actual hours of care provided.
- This prepayment option is being expanded after a successful pilot period with a limited number of certified centers
- Prepayment only applies to certified centers caring for families receiving ERDC.
- DHS is mailing a letter with more information to all certified center providers

ERDC Alternative Care Incentives

Knowing that odd-hour care can be difficult for parents to find, for a limited time DHS will be offering monthly incentive payments to providers who care for children receiving ERDC during alternative hours, defined as:

| Monthly Incentive Amount | Hours of alternative

Weekdays after 7 pm and before 6 am, and/or

Anytime on weekends

A letter explaining this funding along with the provider application is being mailed to all DHS

Monthly Incentive Amount	Hours of alternative care per child per adult
\$250	20+ Hours Per Month
\$500	40+ Hours Per Month

Here is brief description and the learning objective for the training:

The Center for Deployment Psychology (CDP) is offering a new training for daycare and preschool providers. This free training provides an overview of children in daycare or preschool whose parents are serving in the Oregon National Guard. It raises awareness about their unique needs and what distinguishes them from their non-military peers. Aspects of military culture and life that can promote or impede these children's well-being are discussed including parental absence due to deployment. It concludes with strategies and resources that daycare and preschool providers can use to identify and support these children.

Learning Objectives:

- 1. Consider unique challenges faced by National Guard/Reserve-connected children in daycare and preschool
- 2. Specify risk and protective factors that affect National Guard/Reserveconnected children
- 3. Develop strategies and resources to support National Guard/Reserveconnected children

OCC Measles FAQ and Resources for Staff and Partners

Parent/Provider Information	
Question/Topic	Talking Point/Contact Information
Can I exclude a child from care if they are not immunized?	 Yes, if they have been diagnosed with measles Yes, if they are showing signs of illness that meet your facility's exclusion criteria Consult your internal policy and your local health department if you feel you need to exclude for any other reason
Doesn't my child care provider have to exclude children who are not vaccinated?	 Yes,if they have been diagnosed with measles or if they showing signs of illness that meet the facility's exclusion criteria Contact your health care provider if you have questions
What do I need to do if my child has been exposed?	Contact your health care provider, especially if your child is not immunized
What should I do if staff or children are diagnosed with measles?	 All staff or children who show signs or symptoms of measles or who have been diagnosed should be excluded from the program immediately Contact your local health department for additional guidance
When can children or staff return to care?	 Staff or children who have been diagnosed with measles cannot return to the facility for 4 days after their rash begins Contact your health care provider or local health department for additional guidance
What do I do if I think a child in my care has measles?	 Contact the parents Contact your local health department





No Small Matter is a feature-length documentary film and national engagement campaign that brings public attention to this vital question by sharing powerful stories and stunning truths about the human capacity for early intelligence and the potential for quality early care and education to benefit America's social and economic future. This multifaceted project reveals how our country is raising its youngest citizens, why making the most of this time in their lives is so crucial, and most importantly, what we can do to change the perception of when learning begins. The first major theatrical documentary to tackle this topic, No Small Matter is designed to kick-start the public conversation about early care and education. The ultimate goal: to produce an entertaining, accessible, and inspiring film that redefines the audience's understanding of the issue and helps drive it to the top of the political agenda. Or, as one advocate put it, "not just to make a documentary about early childhood education."
