DHS Child Care Provider Types

Department of Human Services (DHS) Child Care Provider Types

A child care provider must be approved by DHS before being eligible to receive payment for child care services on behalf of a subsidy family. To be approved by DHS, all providers must submit a completed Child Care Provider Listing form (DHS 7494) to the Direct Pay Unit (DPU). A provider may have additional requirements to complete before or after being approved by DHS. Requirements are based upon the type of child care provider. Once approved, DHS child care providers must continue to meet DHS provider requirements. A full list of the DHS provider requirements can be found in the DHS Child Care Provider Guide (DHS 7492) or at the DHS website:

These provider are exempt from being licensed with the Early Learning Divisions (ELD), Office of Child Care (OCC)

License exempt Relative Standard Family (FAM)	Provider is related* to all children in their care <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Complete a DHS Child Care Provider Listing form (DHS 7494) Provider and all household members 16 years and older pass a criminal background and CPS check. Meet all DHS Health and Safety and Provider Requirements. Complete <i>Introduction to Child Care Health and Safety</i> Training and <i>DHS Orientation</i> within 90 days of being approved.
License exempt non-relative Standard Family (FAM)	Providers is not a related* to a child in their care. Note additional requirements. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Complete the <i>Introduction to Child Care Health and Safety</i> Training, <i>CPR/First Aid</i>, <i>Recognizing and Reporting Child Abuse and Neglect</i> prior to submitting listing form. Complete a DHS Child Care Provider Listing Form (DHS 7494) Provider and all household members 16 years and older pass a criminal background and CPS check. Pass a Health and Safety Monitoring Visit, meet both DHS and OCC Health and Safety and Provider Requirements. Complete the <i>DHS Orientation</i> within 90 days of being approved. Ongoing <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Pass annual Health and Safety Monitoring Visit. Complete 6 hours of additional training every two years.
Enhanced License Exempt Family (QFM)	Providers that are exempt from licensing and have met their respective requirements above. Can receive a higher rate of pay on behalf of the DHS family, by completing these additional requirements? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Complete and pass the Food Handlers test Registered with the Oregon Registry. (The Oregon Registry is through Portland State University, Oregon Center for Career Development (OCCD)) Complete 8 additional hours of training every two years.

*Relative is defined as great grandparent, grandparent, aunt/uncle or sibling (living outside the home) established by blood, adoption or marriage.

LEHRC– License Exempt Homes and Relative Care DHS Child Care Provider Orientation Classes

This class gives information on The DHS Child Care Subsidy Program options. It helps participants understand the DHS listing and billing process. This class is MANDATORY for Non-Licensed (EXEMPT) caregivers approved by DHS to receive Employment Related Day Care Subsidy payments. Participants will also learn how to become eligible for the DHS Enhanced Rate program that increases what caregivers can get paid for child care from DHS participants will also hear about the SEIU union that represents unlicensed family child care providers. 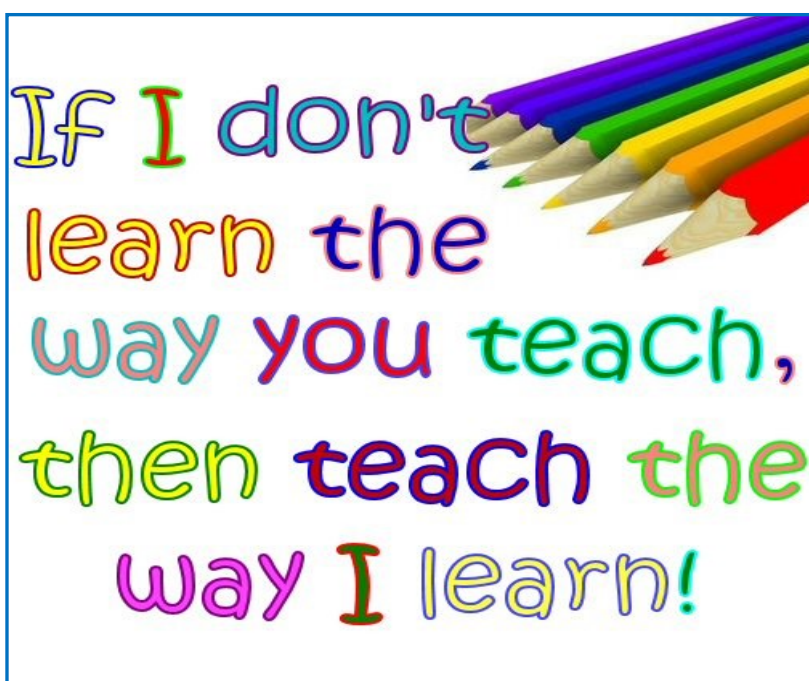

Child Development	Diversity (DIV): Knowledge of differences in race, gender, ability, age, language, family composition, culture, ethnicity, socio-economic status, and/or religion. Weaving anti-bias awareness throughout all program activities and learning environments for children and youth.
	Families & Community Systems (FCS): Knowledge of the complex characteristics of children's families and communities. Establishing respectful relationships and communication with family and community members.
	Human Growth & Development (HGD): Knowledge of social, emotional, cognitive and physical growth and development. Using developmentally appropriate practices and principles in programs for children and youth.
	Learning Environments & Curriculum (LEC): Knowledge of the relationship between physical space, activities, experiences, and materials with child behavior, growth and development. Creating developmentally appropriate and culturally appropriate learning environments and curricula to foster optimum growth and development of children and youth.
	Observation & Assessment (OA): Knowledge of observation techniques, assessment tools, and documentation procedures for children and youth. Using observation and assessment to individualize learning experiences, improve the effectiveness of the learning environment, and support referrals for specialized services.
	Special Needs (SN): Knowledge of disabilities and other special needs, related resources, and regulations/laws. Implementing an inclusive and sensitive practice with children and youth in partnership with families.
	Understanding & Guiding Behavior (UGB): Knowledge of developmentally appropriate and culturally appropriate guidance theories, principles and practices. Providing positive guidance to foster self-esteem, self-regulation, constructive behavior, and positive relationships for children and youth.
Varies (see Note)	<p>Health, Safety & Nutrition (HSN): Knowledge of basic health, safety, and nutrition principles and practices. Knowledge of child abuse and neglect prevention, identification, reporting procedures, and therapeutic care. CLASS PAYMENT POLICY

To register for a class, you **MUST PRE-PAY:**

- We will no longer pre-register over the phone or by email. **All classes require payment upon registration.** This does not apply to classes that are held free of charge or for licensed family providers who are eligible for CPR/FA & RRCAN renewal.
- If not registering ONLINE, each person registering for a class needs to fill out a separate registration form. One form per person. Please make copies as needed or download more copies from our website: www.mycommunityaction.org/CCRR
- **Payments are only transferable within designated program.**
- Placement in a requested class will be on a first-come, first-serve basis. All classes are space limited.
- We are not responsible for any **CASH mailed to us.**

To pay choose your option:

Option # 1: Pay online with credit/debit card through website: <http://mwvcaa.org/programs/ccrr/#tab-id-2> If paying outside of normal business hours on the day of the class or over the weekend, please bring payment confirmation to the class for proof of payment and to receive class certificate of attendance.

Option #2: Complete class registration form and mail with payment's, (check or money order only) to address listed on the form. Payment must be received prior to date of class. We will call if a class is **FULL** when we receive your registration and payment.

Option #3: Complete class registration form and pay in person in our office, prior to the class (during working hours, we will accept cash, check, money order or debit/credit card).

Refund Policy: **NO REFUNDS** – we are only providing **class credit** to those who give prior notice or when a class is cancelled.

Cancellation Policy: Cancellations must be received prior to the class at the latest **by 3pm on the class date**. In the event that class is cancelled, by either CCR&R or the participant, CCR&R will send a **CLASS CREDIT VOUCHER** (Training Bucks) that can be used to attend future workshops. The class credit voucher is good for one year from issue date.

Check Returned Policy
